OUR FUNDS

When people want to make a charitable gift, the most common option is to make a donation to a public charity, such as the Community Foundation of Southeast Kansas (CFSEK) that serves a broad range of causes. The CFSEK permits people to tailor their gifts to serve their charitable interests and financial goals now and in the future.

A wide range of philanthropic options are offered by the CFSEK. They include:

Donor-Advised Funds are often created as an alternative to a private foundation and allow donors to recommend the charitable organizations and causes to be considered for grants.

Field-of-Interest Funds benefit specific areas such as education, youth, health, the arts, etc. that are of interest to the donor. They can also benefit a geographical area.

Unrestricted Funds give the CFSEK the discretion to make grants that address the most urgent needs of the community as they change over time.

Designated Funds make grants to specific organizations chosen by the donor when the fund is established.

Scholarship Funds Donors may designate a particular school, field of study, select eligibility requirements, and name an advisory committee

Agency Endowment Funds are created by other nonprofit organizations as a means of protecting their charitable dollars for the future and to ensure a source of annual support for their programs and operations.


LEGACY SOCIETY

Community Foundation Announces Wealth Transfer Research \$14 BILLION POTENTIAL IN FOUR COUNTY AREA

Research results announced in 2008 by the Kansas Association of Community Foundations, including the Community Foundation of Southeast Kansas, projects that over the next 50 years, more than \$14 billion will transfer from one generation to the next in Bourbon, Cherokee, Crawford, and Labette Counties combined. When considering a 12-year time frame, this wealth transfer is estimated at \$2,426,251,292.

Following the Great Depression and World War II, the United States entered a golden age of business growth and personal prosperity. Americans have created, invested and multiplied unprecedented wealth. Over the next 50 years, this capital – a conservative estimate of \$41 trillion nationwide – will change hands. Most will go to heirs and taxes, but Kansas community foundations are leading an effort to ensure that a portion is preserved and invested in communities across the state.

"For generations, people lived their entire lives close to their birthplace and as wealth passed from one generation to the next, most stayed in the same county. This is no longer true," states Kimberly Clark, Executive Director. "Once the wealth leaves our community, it may never return, so we hope to encourage residents to designate a portion of their estates, 401(k) and IRA accounts or life insurance policies to the CFSEK."

"Our conservative goal is to secure 5 percent of the total amount transferred in Bourbon, Cherokee, Crawford, and Labette Counties by encouraging every resident to give back to their communities through the CFSEK. Through this generosity, we have the potential to add \$121,000,000 to our community foundation in the next 12 years, which would help us provide grants to local nonprofits to address critical needs and strengthen southeast Kansas," states Kimberly Clark.

The Transfer of Wealth study, commissioned by the Kansas Health Foundation, was conducted by the Center for Economic Development and Business Research at Wichita State University. Future intergenerational wealth transfer for each county in Kansas was estimated based on a model initially created by Boston College. According the study, a statewide total of \$598 billion will transfer from one generation to the next by 2060 and \$66 billion will transfer by 2020. Five percent of this 12-year transfer would bring \$3.3 billion to community foundations across Kansas.

"We would invest the dollars and use percentage of the return on investment each year for community betterment projects and programs undertaken by local nonprofits. Within a decade we would be able to address the challenges facing our community and enhance the quality of life for our residents," states Kimberly Clark. IRA Charitable Rollover Update...

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 (PPA) permitted individuals, 70 1/2 or older, to roll over up to \$100,000 from and individual retirement account (IRA) directly to a qualifying charity without recognizing the assets transferred to the qualifying charity as income. While this provision expired on December 31, 2007, the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act of 2008 (H.R. 1424), enacted on October 3, 2008, extended the IRA charitable rollover provision so that eligible contributions may now be made through December 31, 2009.

This is good news for people who want to make a charitable gift during their lifetime from their retirement assets, but have been discouraged from doing so because of the income tax penalty. CFSEK Affiliate: Fort Scott Area Community Foundation **HONOR THE PAST - IMPACT THE FUTURE**

In August 2007, the Fort Scott Area Community Foundation was launched. Not competing with any other fund-raising efforts, the Fort Scott Community Foundation provides a tax-exempt vehicle for charitable gifts to be made to the groups and governmental agencies of the donor's choice.

The FSACF works directly with donors to support their personal goals. Donors can be individuals, families, corporations and other organizations who want to make a difference in their community. It also provides support to local nonprofit organizations through the awarding of grants.

Over the summer, the FSACF assisted the Fort Scott Hurricanes swim team acquire new diving blocks, constructed by Fort Scott's own Twister Trailers. "Our previous diving blocks had been around for years; they did not properly fit to the side of the gutter, were extremely heavy and difficult to maneuver from the shed to the pool deck and back again for practices and meets, and many of them had to be manipulated for each use. The new blocks are lightweight, functional, and easily accessible for use at practices and meets. They are designed to simply insert into the pool deck, much easier and SAFER than forcing them around the pool's gutter!" commented Assistant Coach Jared Leek.

The FSCAF also assisted Richard Goldston in his efforts to support a local Little League Travelling Football Team. Donations were accepted to the FSACF to allow for the 80 local grid-ironers in third, fourth, six,

and eighth grade teams to play in a league with Arma, Girard, and Frontenac, without having to travel to Nevada for games and practices. The goal of Goldston and the local league is to raise \$20,000.00 to make this a reality. Funds are still being accepted by the FSCAF.

GIVING CIRCLES

Giving Circles are generally defined as a group of individuals who pool their time and resources to collectively focus contributions in a common area of interest or social issue. The benefits of this idea of collective giving allow members to learn about philanthropy, their community, as well as specific areas of need, all while making an immediate impact.

The CFSEK currently hosts two giving circles, the Future Fund and the Rita J. Bicknell Women's Giving Circle. Both are comprised of community members who want to have an impact in southeast Kansas and are using their collective resources to build a permanent endowment fund thereby establishing long term sustainability for worthwhile initiatives. FUTURE FUND

The Future Fund began in the spring of 2005, and in 2008 it boasted a membership of nearly 150 residents in Crawford County. A yearly membership is open to anyone making a \$250.00 donation. Membership social events are held twice a year.

The Future Fund group met November 1, 2008 at Europe Park for a Moonlight Macabre and annual business meeting. During the business meeting, the Future Fund grant committee presented 3 grant candidates for review. Those in attendance voted to grant \$1,860.00 to the Crisis Resource Center of Pittsburg to help fund new playground area, and \$1,976.00 to the Colonial Fox Foundation to help fund their annual Festival on Broadway.

Annual membership for the Future Fund is a \$250.00 contribution. 100% of each contribution is placed into an endowed fund, that allows disbursement of 5% of the principle balance for grant-making.

RITA J. BICKNELL WOMEN'S GIVING CIRCLE

The Rita J. Bicknell Women's Giving Circle began in December of 2007. The mission of this fund is: "To improve the health and well being of women by supporting education, increasing awareness, and sharing quality of life opportunities to benefit all women."

In the fall of 2008, the Rita J. Bicknell Women's Giving Circle held their first Grant Cycle, inviting applications that addressed a need in women's health that was not currently being met. On November 5, 2008, the Circle met and awarded \$9,000.00 to the Community Health Center of Southeast Kansas for their Eye Care for Women Project.

The annual membership contribution for the Women's Giving Circle is \$2,000.00. Fifty percent of each contribution will be placed in the endowment fund, while the remaining will be used by the circle to grant back to the community.

2008 General Funds GRANTS AWARDED

The following is a list of grants awarded to local agencies and organizations for programs with an emphasis on children and families, education and leadership, community development, and arts and culture (in Pittsburg):

Bourbon County Coalition: To fund the "Network for Families Fund" to provide financial assistance with rent, utilities, medical, and emergency support for low-income families in Bourbon County.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Crawford County: To be used for six "Little Moments – Big Magic" activities to increase public awareness, recruit volunteers, and to provide social interaction for the participants. This program serves at risk children in Crawford County ages 5-17.

Community Health Center of Southeast Kansas: To be used for the "Reach Out and Read" program to distribute developmentally appropriate books to children, and to encourage parents to read aloud to the children. This program primarily serves low-income children in Crawford and Cherokee County.

Catholic Charities: To provide funds for utility assistance, baby supplies, prescription assistance, gas vouchers to help the unemployed secure and retain new employment, and materials/workbooks for free parenting classes for low income families and individuals in Crawford, Cherokee, Bourbon, and Labette Counties.

Salvation Army: To provide meals, transportation expenses, and education materials for the Youth Character Building Programs in the upcoming year. This program is for Crawford County children ages 5-18.

Girl Scout Council of the Ozark Area: Funds will be used to help complete the repairs to the Columbus Girl Scout House from flood damage caused by the recent flooding in SEK. The Girl Scout House is used by the community of Columbus year round.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Bourbon County: To be used for three "Fun-Day Events" to increase public awareness, recruit volunteers, and to provide social interaction for the participants. This program serves at risk children in Bourbon County ages 5-17.

Covenant Harvest Church: To provide materials for "Operation Car Care," an event for single mothers and single women in Southeast Kansas needing help with car maintenance (oil change & safety inspection), and car seat inspection and replacement.

Partnership for All Cherokee County Children: To support "PACCC the Backpack," a program that provides backpacks and school supplies for school children in Cherokee County. This program will serve approximately 500 children in the 2009 school year.

Christ's Community Church: To provide funding to purchase food for the "Food Box Ministry." This program serves families in emergency situations in Southeast Kansas with food for a week.

New Hope Special Olympics: To help provide green fees, equipment, and uniforms for their "Summer Special Olympics Sports Program." This year the program is applying to add golf to their list of summer sports activities for over 30 individuals with intellectual disabilities.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Labette County: To be used for four "Match Activities" to increase public awareness, recruit volunteers, and to provide social interaction for the participants. This program serves at risk children in Labette County ages 5-17.

Memorial Auditorium: To help provide support for the presentation of Tchaikovsky's Nutcracker Ballet. This program will support the community in two ways: a dress rehearsal to be dedicated to the Children's Miracle Network, and to provide school performances to the districts in southeast Kansas.

Colonial Fox Theatre Foundation: To provide support for the "Festival on Broadway," a program that works to provide education in art experience for young and emerging artists.

Wesley House: To be used to purchase food and supplies for the 2009 Children's Summer Food Program. This program serves low-income families in Crawford County that have children ages 1-17.

Mt. Carmel Regional Medical Center: To help fund the "Prescription Assistance Program" that provides immediate medication assistance to uninsured or underinsured children and families residing in Southeast Kansas.

Boy Scouts Council of the Ozark Area: To support the "School Night for Scouting" program that works to recruit children to the Boy Scouts program in Cherokee, Bourbon, and Crawford Counties. This year the program looks to add over 250 children to their program.

2008 Nutrition and Physical Activity PROJECT GRANTS AWARDED

The following grants were awarded to local agencies and organizations as a part of the Nutrition and Physical Activity Project. Funding for this project was provided by the Kansas Health Foundation, Wichita, Kansas. The Kansas Health Foundation is a philanthropic organization whose mission is to improve the health of all Kansans:

Mini-Grants:

SEK Interlocal 637: Funds for the continuation of Healthy and Safe Beginnings. This program began in 2007, and works to introduce fruits and vegetables and physical activity to 24 preschool age children, 12 with special needs, at Lakeside Elementary.

Elm Acres Foundation: To purchase wii consoles to implement healthier indoor activities in conjunction with their wellness plan that helps mentor residents in their nutritional and physical activity choices.

KIDS FIRST Daycare: To purchase supplies for the "Hooray for Health" program. This program is a continuation of the 2007 "Healthy Kids" program. To last years program, "Hooray for Health" is starting a walking program to encourage family activity, as well as parent meetings for additional nutritional information. This program will serve 54 children from infancy to six years of age, and their families, in Crawford County.

USD 248-Girard: To fund two "Family Movin' Nights." Each event will be held to educate and encourage families in healthy lifestyle habits. These events will also serve as a kick-off for their larger NPA program, and will be continued through weekly NPA newsletters. This program will serve approximately 430 students and their families in Girard.

Grants:

Pittsburg Mother to Mother: To fund seven reflection meeting supporting NPA-focused healthy lifestyle changes. Lessons learned and activities practiced at the reflection meetings will be supported through the mother to mother mentoring program and goal setting. This program will serve approximately 30 women and their families in Crawford County.

USD 234-Fort Scott: Funds will help to support the "Healthy-Inside and Out" program that will connect at children identified as at-risk due to a high BMI, blood cholesterol, and blood

glucose levels with a registered dietician and personal trainer to create a healthier lifestyle plan. This program will be used to support the health and wellness program currently supported by the KDHE in Fort Scott Schools, and will serve approximately 460 middle-school students.

K-State Extension Offices in Bourbon, Crawford, and Allen Counties: To support the Walk Kansas for Kids program in the 10 school districts of the three counties with matching funds to provide incentives, and nutritional education and weekly newsletters for the students. This program will serve at least 3000 elementary students and their families in Crawford, Bourbon, and Allen counties.

Class LTD: To fund the "A BIG Dose of B-6" program for Class LTD employees and clients. The program will be an incentive-based health and wellness initiative designed to improve nutrition and increase physical activity through education, peer support, and group motivation activities. This program will serve approximately 50 people, including 25 with disabilities.

USD 248-Girard: To help support the "Healthy Living on a Budget" program that will partner the school with the community of Girard to help participants learn about nutrition and physical activity. The program will be every other week for three months in the spring and will include a walking challenge, nutrition classes, and a jumpstart to a healthier lifestyle.

USD 250-PCMS: To continue support of "Dragons Fired-Up for Change!" a 30 week, intramural program for walking, cooking, and education. The program will be available to all female students in grades 6, 7, and 8 at Pittsburg Middle School, and will offer education and motivation through activities and rewards for participation, as well as small group mentoring.

Southeast Kansas Education Center: To fund "Greenbush Healthy Start," a program designed to implement healthy lifestyle changes to Greenbush employees by utilizing healthy breakfast meetings and walking teams. The program will promote mentoring through an online motivational and tracking website, as well as morning meetings, and will serve approximately 120 employees.

Crawford County Health Department: To support "I am Moving, I am Learning," a governmental program to increase the nutrition and physical activity of children in the Head Start program in Crawford, Cherokee, and Labette Counties.

City of Parsons: To support "Wellness in the Workplace." This program will incorporate a sixweek walking program with lunch and learn sessions and a health fair to enhance the physical well-being of the 128 employees of the City of Parsons, and their families.

St. Mary's Elementary and Junior High Schools: To fund the "Fat's Out – Fit's In" program for fitness and nutrition improvement, with peer groups, mentoring, education, and incentives to help participants meet health and wellness goals. This program is for the faculty and staff of St. Mary's Schools.

Youth Wellness Camp: To support a portion of the "Youth Wellness Camp" held in the summer of 2009 at PSU. This program provides an opportunity for the youth of Crawford County to participate in sports activities as well as learn about proper nutrition choices. These funds will be directly used for nutrition and physical activity education.

Nutrition and Physical Activity **PROJECT UPDATE**

In the fall of 2006, the CFSEK received a 3 year-\$300,000 grant from the Kansas Health Foundation to improve nutrition and physical activity awareness in the southeast Kansas area. The Kansas Health Foundation is a philanthropic organization whose mission is to improve the health of all Kansans. In 2008, the CFSEK moved into its second year of the project.

During the spring of 2008, the Community
Foundation expanded the program from Crawford
County into Bourbon, Cherokee, and Labette
Counties. This expansion was facilitated by
a Listening Tour which asked citizens and
community leaders about current availability
and needs in the realm of nutrition and physical
activity. The Tour presented to 20 groups and
nearly 300 participants of all ages. The results of
the 2008 Listening Tour were used to guide the
2008 Grant Application process. The 2008 NPA
Grant Cycle resulted in over \$63,000 awarded

to 15 local agencies and organizations. (For a complete list of NPA Grants awarded, please turn to page 16).

The 2008 Listening Tour also sparked the organization of Health and Wellness Committees in Bourbon, Cherokee, and Labette Counties. During the year, each committee began work to put together a strategic plan to address the health and wellness needs of their respective counties. The health and wellness committee of Crawford County, Live Well Crawford County, continued their work supporting better nutrition and physical activity habits through the county's school districts.
