

RJB Women's Health Fund History

In 2007 our founder Rita J. Bicknell brought together a small group of women to discuss the idea of creating a Women's Giving Circle in Southeast



Kansas. Rita's vision was to establish a collaborative effort in which women could pool their money, work together to learn about women's health needs during challenging times, provide opportunities in awarding grants and make social investments in improving the lives of women and girls in the region.

With this in mind, the RJB Women's Health Fund Giving Circle was formed. To establish the fund more than a dozen women each pledged \$2,000 and became founding members of the Women's Giving Circle. The agreement was for \$1,000 from each pledge to go to establishing an endowed fund to ensure future grant funding in perpetuity to benefit women and girls. The remaining \$1,000 from each pledge would go to immediate annual grants.

Today, we find ourselves helping each other fill the emptiness we feel in our organization with the untimely death of Rita last year. We are finding a new sense of responsibility and energy and are committed to fulfilling our mission *"to improve the health and well being* of women by supporting education, increasing awareness and sharing quality of life opportunities to benefit all women."
