# Celebrating \$1.25m raised by Match Day

On November 29, CFSEK hosted its seventh annual Match Day event. CFSEK hosts Match Day each year to join in the celebration of generosity on Giving Tuesday, a national day dedicated to giving and philanthropy.

CFSEK has announced a recordbreaking 2022 Match Day grand total of \$269,793.46! Community donations totaled \$218,793.46, and CFSEK provided an additional \$51,000 in prorated matching funds in support of 36 local nonprofit organizations. Contributions to the participating organizations will grow their endowed funds held at the Community Foundation, generating income annually to help them achieve their missions.

"We have such an amazing and generous community," said Devin Gorman, CFSEK executive director. "We appreciate the hundreds of individuals who donated on Match Day and who are helping our local




organizations continue the outstanding services they provide to our community."

Since the Foundation's first Match Day in 2016, nearly \$1.25 million in total contributions and matching funds have been given in support of local nonprofit organizations.

"Match Day continues to grow each year, and we sincerely thank the individuals and businesses in our community who understand the impact their gifts make," Gorman said. "We are grateful to everyone who supports the mission of the Community Foundation and for making the choice to invest in the future of our Southeast Kansas community."

# **CFSEK Supports Cold-Weather Shelter in Pittsburg**



CFSEK is providing a \$10,000 matching grant to support The Gathering Place, a 90-day emergency cold-weather shelter located at Wesley House in Pittsburg. Wesley House and the Community Health Center of Southeast Kansas, which together are organizing the temporary shelter, are seeking \$50,000 in total funding. CFSEK's grant will match the first \$10,000 in community support for the shelter.
